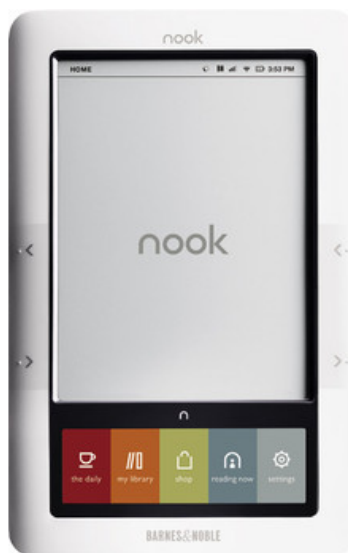


# Wi-Fi Internet Access Connection Procedure

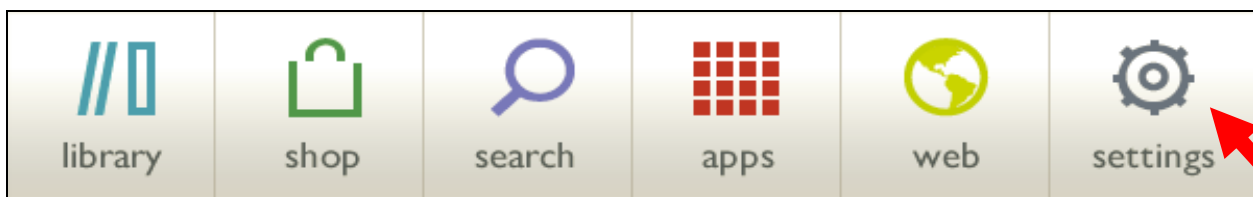
## **B&N NOOK Color**

The library has provided wireless network service to connect your personal NOOK Color to the World Wide Web while at your public library. All you need is a NOOK Color, wireless adapter (Wi-Fi) and web browser. (NOTE: Your web browser must have cookies enabled to access the internet.)

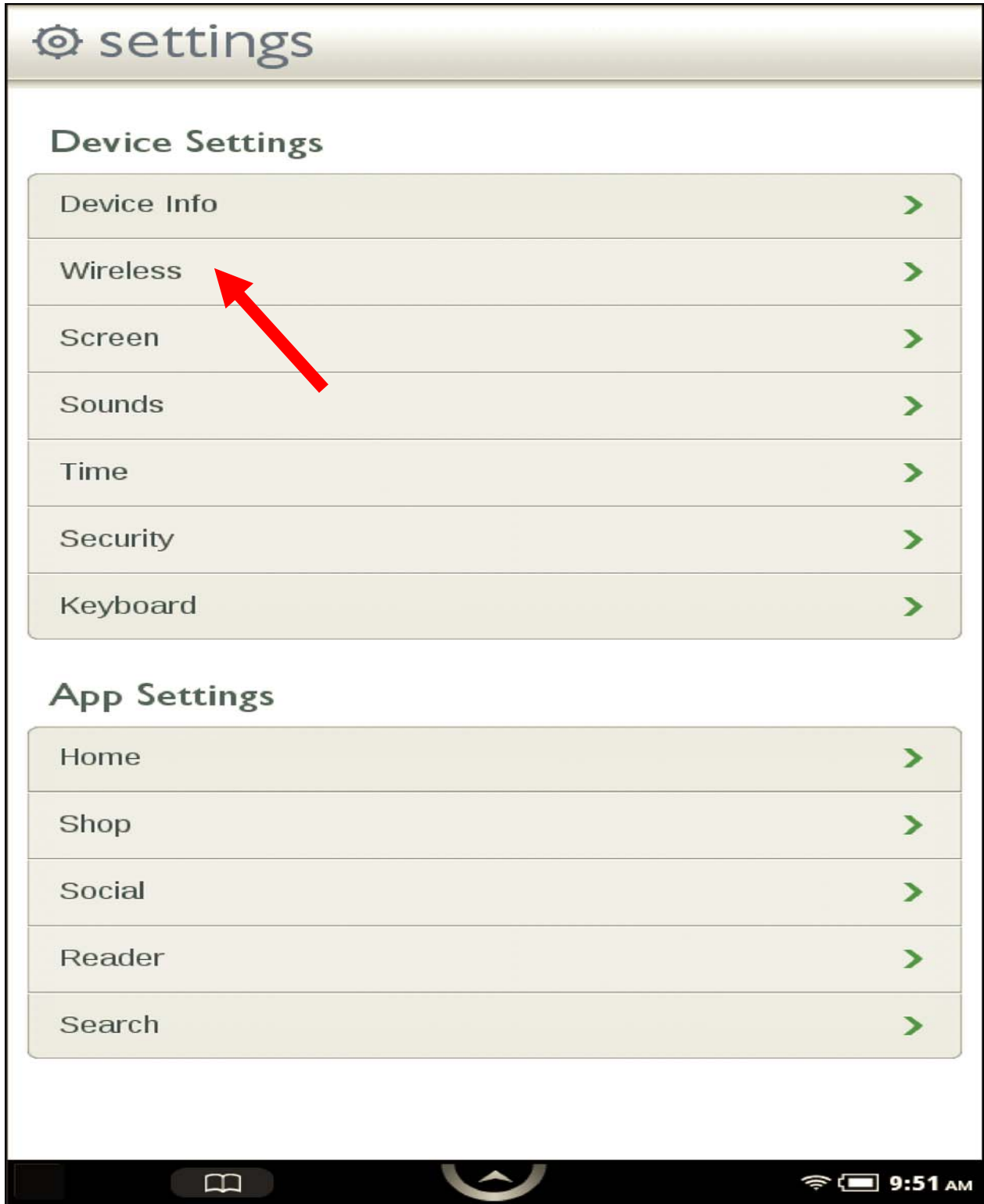
The following section describes in detail how to connect to a wireless network using the **Quick Nav Bar** on the NOOK Color. This document presumes that you have the appropriate permissions on your nook to setup a wireless connection. NOTE: NOOK Color may have additional security features that may periodically ask you if you want to continue making changes during the wireless setup process.



1. To begin open the **Quick Nav Bar** and tap the *Settings* icon.



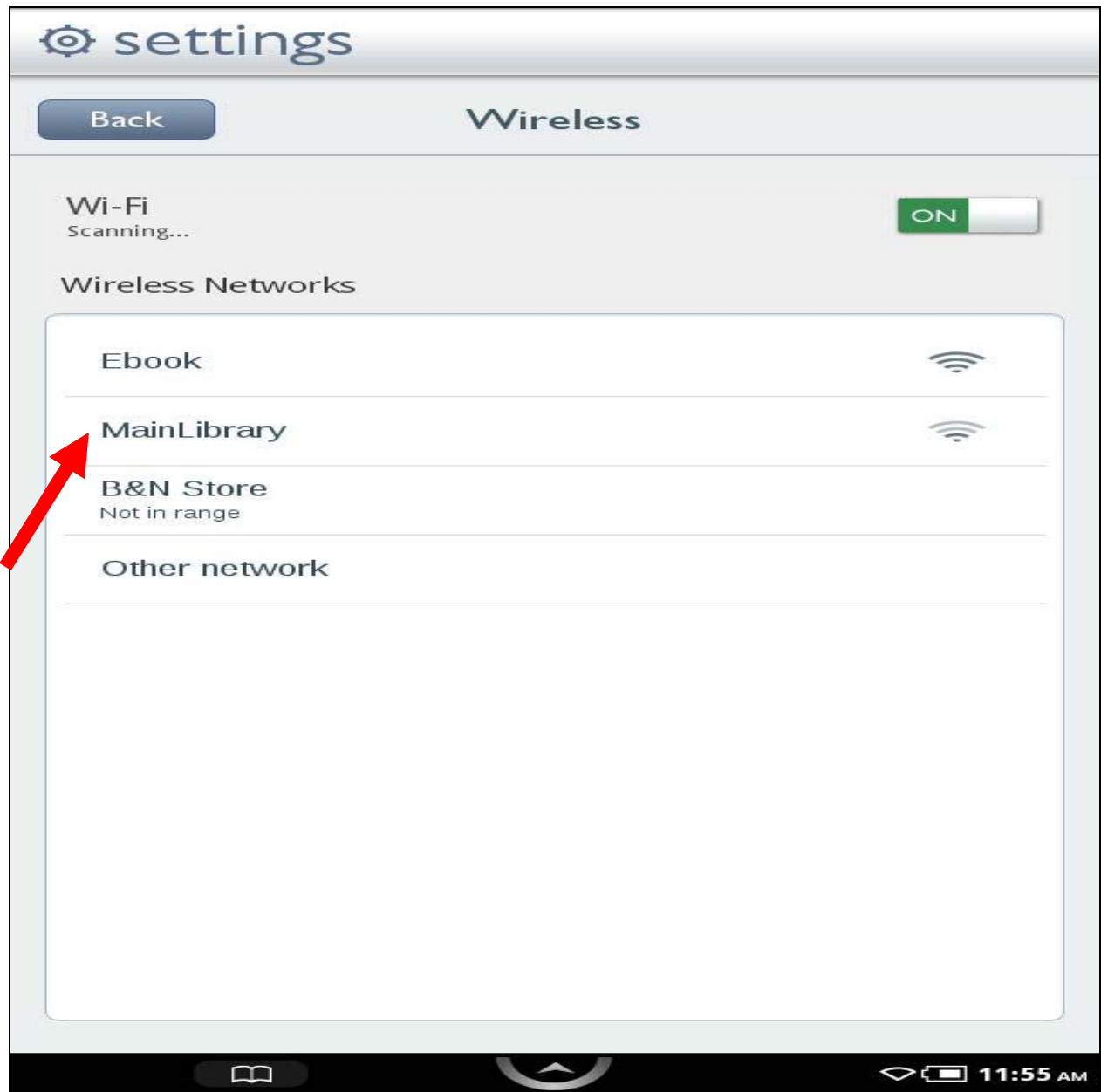
2. On the *Settings* screen tap on the *Wireless* category to get to the screen where you will connect to a wireless network as shown below.



3. On the Wireless settings page, tap the Wi-Fi button to change its status from Off to On.

NOTE: If Wi-Fi networking is turned off, you will not be able to access the Shop, share information with friends, download new books, magazines, or newspapers, or perform any other action that requires a live network connection.

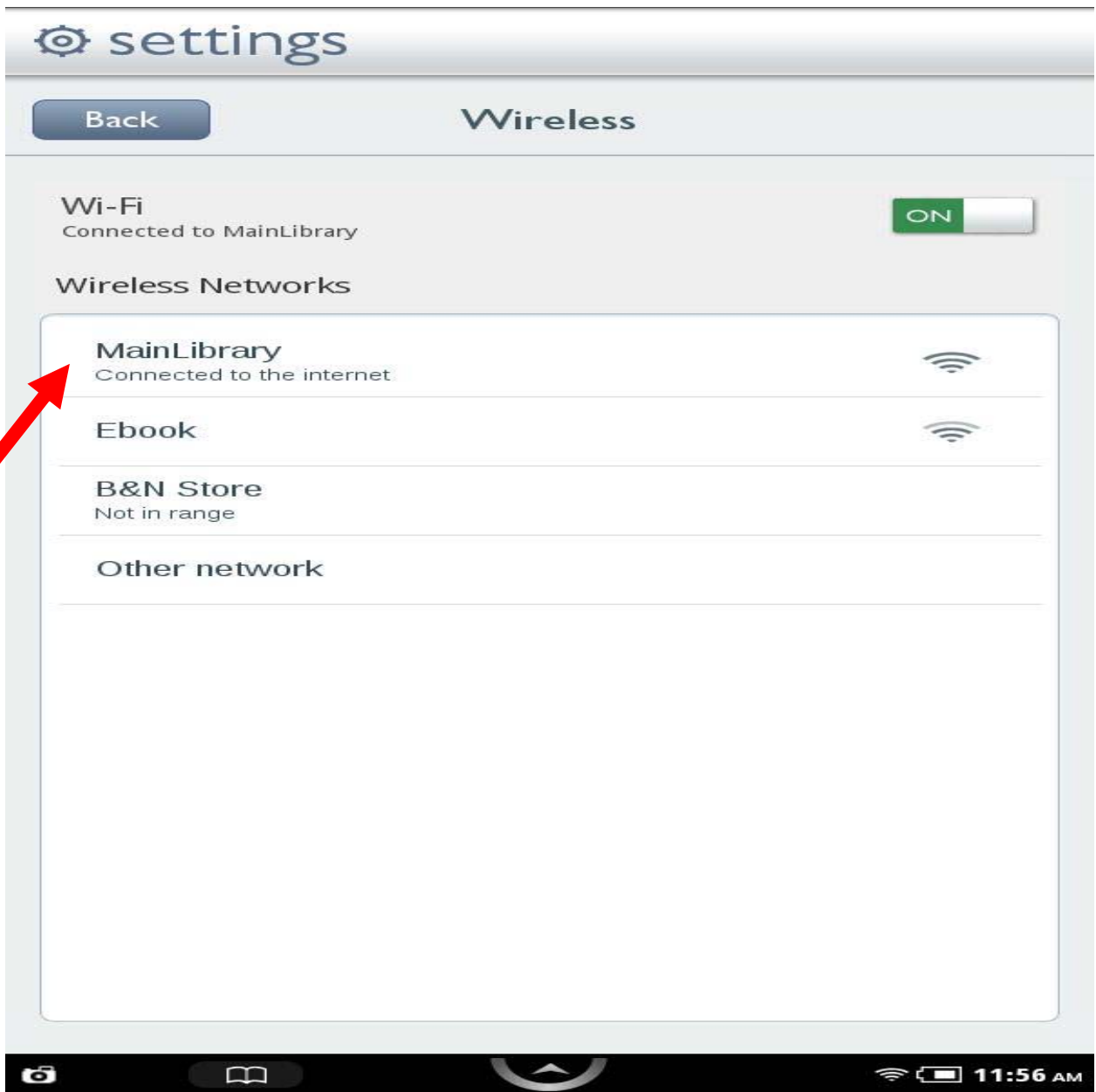
4. A list of wireless networks will be displayed under the “*Wireless Networks*” field. These are all the networks that are within range of your NOOK. Find the network that displays the **Library’s Name** and tap on it. (Ex. “*MainLibrary*”)



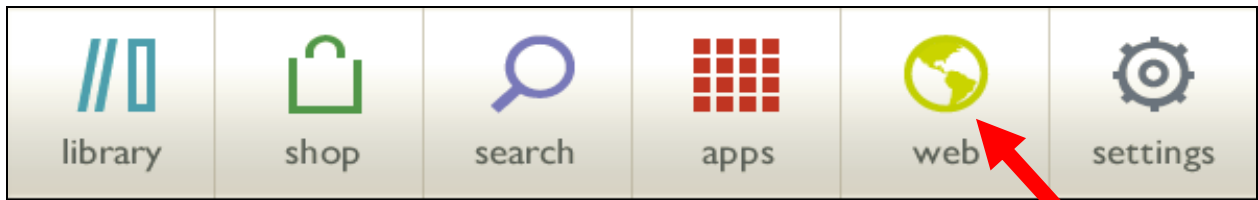
5. The NOOK will now display the following screen, tap on connect.



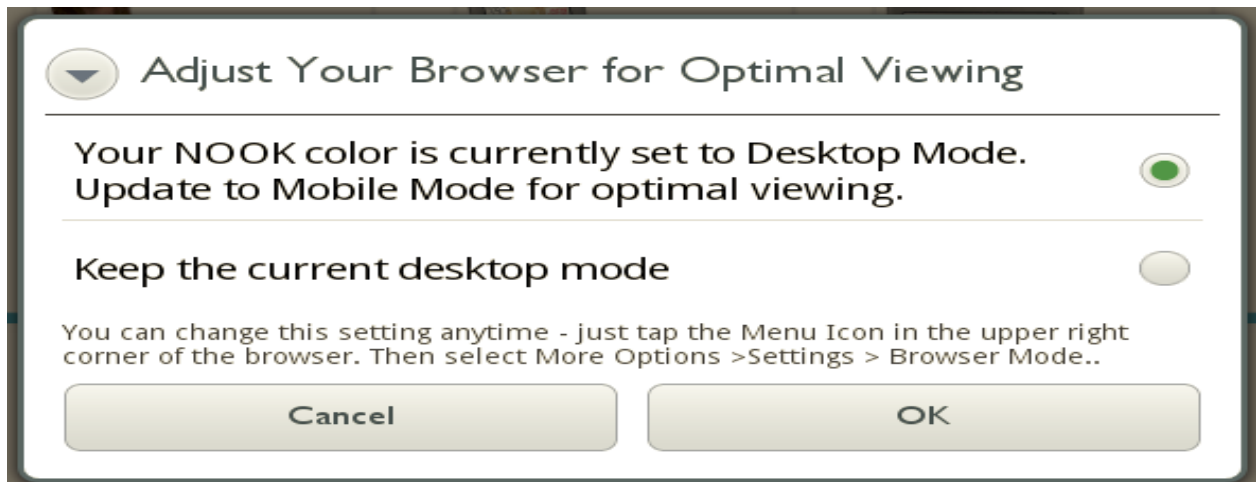
The NOOK will attempt to connect to the network, and when finished, will display the Wi-Fi settings screen again, but this time with the joined network listed with "Connected to the internet" displayed underneath it, as shown below.



6. Now that your connection has been established, open your web browser by tapping on the Web icon on the Quick Nav Bar.



NOTE: The first time you launch the browser, a dialog box opens and asks you how you would like your browser to present content—in mobile mode like a browser configured for displaying content on a smart phone, or in desktop mode like a browser on your personal computer. Tap the selection you want and then tap OK.



7. You will be directed to the page shown below:



Tap **Continue** to access the Internet.
